Palliative Care

Palliative care is specialized medical care supported by an interdisciplinary team that cares for both perinatal and pediatric patients. Perinatal palliative care helps families who receive a life limiting prenatal diagnosis. Our team will provide guidance at the time of diagnosis to assist families with the difficult choices.

Care continues during the pregnancy, the birth of the child focusing on quality of life and comfort to include physical and psychosocial support. Our pediatric palliative care program works with children and families with life threatening or chronic illness. The focus is on wellness with the goal of improving quality of life.

Palliative care provides an extra layer of support in partnership and collaboration with the family and primary care provider from prenatal diagnoses to young adults. Palliative care will support a patient and family for a few days or many years and is not limited to the last few days of life.

Additional Staff, Community Outreach and Volunteers

Our team is supported by community volunteers of professionals and bereaved parents. These volunteers enhance our program immensely by their input and guidance in assisting families going through difficult times. Organizations in the community also assist families coping with having a child with life limiting illness and end of life issues.

The Palliative Care team has access to Child Life Services to assist with patient and sibling support issues. We have a pastoral care volunteer to assist staff and patients in working through illness and death through their expertise in religious and spiritual issues.



Bereavement Services

Bereavement services are provided through the palliative care team as we realize that the death of a loved one is a devastating loss. Through bereavement counseling families do not have to learn to cope with the difficult feelings and emotions alone. Our services are available for parents, siblings and extended family.
