OBJECTIVES

1. Identify common developmental delays in NICU graduates.
2. Describe the pathophysiology and clinical presentation of congenital heart disease in the neonate.
3. Describe the nutritional status of the preterm infant at time of discharge.
4. Explain developmental and growth outcomes of preterm infants as related to nutrition.
5. List nutrients that are commonly supplemented in the post discharge feeding strategy.
6. Discuss advantages of breast milk for the preterm infant after hospital discharge and strategies for supporting the breastfeeding mother.
7. Demonstrate strategies for monitoring and evaluation of nutritional status post discharge.
8. Explain the metabolism of vitamin D in premature infants.
9. State current guidelines for vitamin D intake and measurements of sufficiency in premature infants.
10. Explain the effects of inadequate vitamin D intake in premature infants.
11. State the importance of appropriate and adequate fatty acid intake throughout the lifecycle.
12. State the importance of adequate mineral intake throughout the lifecycle.
13. State the importance and changing role of vitamin intake throughout the lifecycle.
14. Explain why some families choose to continue a pregnancy despite a life-limiting prenatal diagnosis.
15. Identify ways to support these families through the model of perinatal hospice and palliative care.
16. Describe the origins and development of perinatal hospice and palliative care.
17. Define the meaning of palliative and hospice care.
18. Identify at least two fetal life-limiting diagnoses.
19. Discuss the three goals of a perinatal palliative care/hospice program.
